3.1 Zoning Amendment, File #ZBL-16-2024, 583 Limoges Road

Carole Servais asks if the Municipality can require that a 8 feet high fence be installed to ensure the privacy for private neighbouring residences.

Director of Planning, Guylain Laflèche says that it can be indicated as a requirement in the site plan agreement.

Ward 2 Councillor, Alain Mainville, asks how many sheds are expected to be built.

Guylain Laflèche answers that the plan includes a maximum of 8 sheds.

Ward 5 Councillor, Daniel Boisevenue, asks that we verify with Deputy Fire Chief if the residence in question falls under the vulnerable occupancy status.

Ward 1 Councillor, Tim Stewart, asks if the residences are staffed at all time and if the sheds will be accessible by emergency services if needed.

Guylain Laflèche answers that the residence will have to manage the logistics of emergency preparedness when they reach that stage.
